WHAT IS INCONCERT?

AN INVESTMENT IN YOUTH AND THE COMMUNITY

Harvard Education Professor Howard Gardner describes effective arts education programs as those where artistic learning is organized around "meaningful projects, which are carried out over a significant period of time, and allow ample opportunity for feedback, discussion, and reflection."

In line with this, InConcert, a partnership between the Cochran Wrenn Duo and Marlborough Public Schools (MPS), will introduce students and the community to the process of composing and performing a piece of music for flute and guitar with band. This collaboration will broaden the community's understanding of chamber music and the composition process, engage students in the creative process, foster creativity, inspire interest in new music, and enhance the profile of the MPS music program.

The core of InConcert is the commissioning of a new piece to be performed by the Cochran Wrenn Duo with the Marlborough High School Wind Ensemble. We will commission the composition from Cody Forrest, an early career composer and recent graduate from New England Conservatory.

But this project is more than a commission—it's an educational initiative, a platform for community engagement and an opportunity to inspire emotional investment in the arts. The commissioned composer will gather student input to influence the process of creating the composition, lead discussions about the composition process with the students, participate in the multimedia blog, participate in rehearsals with the wind ensemble, and attend the premiere.

Q: When will InConcert take place?

A: The Cochran Wrenn Duo and composer Cody Forrest will begin working with MPS students in May 2017 and continue through the world premiere of the composition in May 2018. InConcert's innovative approach to music education has been recognized recently with a Boston Conservatory Alumni Entrepreneurial Award, a Marlborough Cultural Council Grant and as a finalist in the 2016 National Flute Association Arts Venture Competition.
